Milton M. Shenton - The Man and His Memories, by Margaret Ann Shenton, 6 June 2012

On the 68th anniversary of D-Day (June 6, 1944), in honor of those who served and sacrificed during World War II, the family of Milton M. Shenton share his personal recollections of the Normandy invasion at Utah Beach on D-Day and his part in the liberation of Paris, France in August 1944. Margaret Ann Shenton, daughter of Milton, presents her memories, supported with videos, photo slides and other memorabilia on the experiences and heroic deeds of her father during his WWII service and his pre- and post-war life.

Milton Shenton was born and raised on Taylors Island, Maryland, and with the exception of his military service from 1941-1945, lived his entire life in Dorchester County. He was a decorated U.S. Army veteran, a skilled waterman and marksman, husband of 53 years to the love of his life (Peggy Barnes), beloved father of three and cherished grandfather of four, writer of poems and short stories, lead singer in the Chaplain Quartet, wood carver of waterfowl and children's toys, and raconteur (story teller) extraordinaire. His family will present a small portion of their treasured memorabilia.
